Many thanks and much appreciation go to Jack Piper and Susan Garry for their many years of service to the City. From the first conception of incorporating to the actual incorporation, they both were heavily involved. Jack was the very first mayor of the city and Susan was one of the very first council members.

There will not be many drastic changes coming to the city soon. The city council has passed a nuisance ordinance which addresses unused vehicles, rubbish, etc. I would like property owners, and renters as well, to read this ordinance and maintain their properties accordingly without city involvement. However, lack of compliance will cause the owner, renter, and the city time and money. All of this is unnecessary if properties are properly maintained. I hear all the time "keep Coupland, Coupland." My perspective on that statement stems from my being here since 1974. The properties within the city were well maintained for the most part. This has changed over the years due to different property owners and citizens. I would appeal to the people of Coupland to maintain your properties without the involvement of the City of Coupland.

## President's Message—Coupland History

I hope everyone had a great holiday season. The Coupland Civic Organization's busiest time is in the fall. We did have a highly successful Choo Choo Fest. Unfortunately, we had to cancel Trunk or Treat this year because of inclement weather. This coming October, we will have a Plan B in place for an alternative setting.

I am continuing the history of Coupland as written by my father, C.W. (Bill) Pfluger. This tells of the very beginning of Coupland City. Previously I wrote about the Coupland City Company and its advertising for Coupland City.

The circulars had a map of the proposed city and information as follows: "This new city offers inducements to capitalists who are seeking investments on LARGE, SURE AND INCREASING INCOME for their investments."

"To Merchants, mechanics, and trades-people—an eligible location to make their labor, energy, enterprise and intelligence bear fruit a hundred fold."

"Wood and water in abundance for all necessary purposes."

"Brushy Creek a constant, clear running stream is near the north boundary of the City." "This section is equally well adopted to grazing or agriculture. Cotton, all the cereals, vegetables and fruits do well."

"No farmer who has cultivated his land well here, but what has made good crops in the most drougthy season."

"The scenery is magnificent, soil rich, climate healthy. A visit in the spring time to this beautiful prairie will repay its costs."

"Williamson County, with her fine farms and fine blooded stock, is rightfully named the BANNER County of the state."

"Lands near Coupland City can be purchased at reasonably low figures, and on easy terms by early applicants."

"Good hotel accommodations are had at Taylor, Elgin or Bastrop from which places trains will be run on the day of sale."

"Terms of Sale: All sums of \$100 or under cash: over \$100, one-third cash, balance in one and two years."

We can deduce from the advertising campaign that Coupland City, Texas, was a speculative real estate venture significantly enhanced by its location on the new Taylor, Bastrop and Houston railway."





I've always dreamed of writing a book, but this one pretty much wrote itself because it is based on a true story! I wrote it right after the actual event almost 10 years ago. But I didn't have any options for getting it published, especially without illustrations.


Since we moved to our land outside of Coupland over 12 years ago, I've connected with many like-minded homesteaders. One such friend, Janet Garman, who has had several homestead-related books published through traditional publishers, wrote a children's book at the same time I wrote mine, and we were critique partners. She ended up selfpublishing her book, *Margarita and the Beautiful Gifts*.

Through the years, Janet has met many people that had good ideas for books but no publishing outlet other than the expensive self-publishing option. So she decided to start a "micro" publishing company, Sawdust Publishing, and she said, "Now, about that Cisco story you wrote..."

Janet helped me find an illustrator, Lynn Baker, and I paid for the illustrations. I wanted total control of the art because I had very specific pictures in my head for the illustrations. Once the illustrations were done, Sawdust Publishing took over with editing, layout, printing, and distribution.

I have had so much encouragement and support from my colleagues at my "day job." It is an indescribable feeling to have so many coworkers send me pictures of themselves or their kiddos with a copy of my book they purchased! Sadly, we lost our beloved Cisco on Christmas Eve 2022, a couple of months shy of his 11th birthday. It means even more to me that he will now live on in the hearts of so many through this book.





## Spotlight on Jessica Mason

**Question**: Tell us what you do and how long you've been in Coupland.

**Answer**: I've been in Coupland since 2018. I'm a Registered Interior Designer, and I specialize in decorative hardware. I have a showroom in downtown Taylor that showcases many of the hardware manufacturers I represent.

**Question**: Where did you grow up? Where did you go to school?

**Answer**: I grew up in the Missouri City suburbs of Southwest Houston. I started at the University of Houston then I transferred to Texas State University in San Marcos where I earned my degree in Interior Design.

**Question:** What kinds of projects do you normally work on? What are your favorite projects?

**Answer:** I normally work with other design and construction professionals. I specify everything from door hardware to cabinet hardware to door tracks and bath accessories. My projects

are a mix of new builds and remodels – both residential and commercial. Remodel projects can often be more challenging, and I feel like Nancy Drew - searching for the right door hardware or finding the perfect knobs and pulls. I especially like remodel projects with salvaged doors.

**Question**: Tell us about your involvement in the design community?

**Answer**: When I was in school, I held different volunteer positions with the American Society of Interior Designers (ASID). After graduation, I got involved with the ASID Austin Design Community. I planned several events for the Austin Design Community including design awards, continuing education days, and student events. Then I became Professional Development Director for ASID at the state level. I believe that design can really impact lives. I want to educate and advocate for the design community.

**Question**: Tell us about your involvement in the Coupland community?

Answer: I never really thought my skill set could help a small community like Coupland, but then I helped the Coupland Water Supply Corporation with a new logo several years ago at no charge. A few years ago, I also helped the Huntington Sculpture Foundation – another nonprofit in Coupland – with new marketing materials. I'm glad I'm able to help the community!

**Question**: What's your favorite thing about Coupland? **Answer**: I love that though small, Coupland has its own quiet, quirky personality. It feels remote enough from Austin to feel like a getaway, and though small, you shouldn't discount it. We know who we are and we're not trying to be anything else but Coupland.

## New Sweden Church News

The Lenten season for New Sweden Lutheran Church starts on Wednesday, February 14, Ash Wednesday, at 7 p.m., with Holy Communion and Imposition of the Ashes. For the next five weeks we will have midweek Lenten services. Each Wednesday evening, there will be a meal at 6 p.m. with a worship service at 7 p.m. in the parish hall.

Holy Week starts on Palm Sunday, March 24, with worship service at 10:30 a.m. Maundy Thursday service will be at 7 p.m. on Thursday, March 28, and will conclude with the stripping of the altar and the Discipline of Silence. On Good Friday, we will meet for an evening meal at 6 p.m. with a Lenten film following.

We will celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus on Easter Sunday, March 31. We have a sunrise service at the New Sweden Cemetery at 7 a.m. An Easter breakfast will be served at 8, and there will be an Easter Egg hunt at 9:30 a.m. at the parish hall. The Easter festival service will be held at 10:30 a.m.

Normally, during the month of April, we hold a "Swedish Festival" on a given Saturday. We plan to have that celebration this year and the date will be set soon. The festival includes a Swedish meal featuring Swedish meatballs and Swedish Rye bread. It is a time to remember the saints who founded this church over 148 years ago.

#### Blessing of the Bicycles

The blessing of the bicycles is now an annual event at New Sweden Church. Last year over 150 cyclists came for a short service at 10:30 a.m. This year the blessing will take place on Saturday, April 6. After the service, cyclists may come and receive an individual blessing for their bike.

Over the past years, our congregation has come to feel that "Kimbro," a dog owned by our president, Jack Atterstrom, deserved a special designation of "Church Dog." I am excited about the opportunity to work with the Coupland ISD community in an effort to continue and expand upon great traditions while building and planning strategically for an even greater tomorrow.

As the district grows, so too does the need to continuously improve. In order to prepare for a great future, a plan is necessary. A strategic plan is extremely useful in clarifying the direction of the district and help to establish realistic goals and objectives that align with the district's mission, vision, values, and beliefs. This process will prioritize efforts, effectively allocate resources, align the community with the organizational goals, while ensuring that the goals are data-driven and are of sound reasoning. All stakeholders in the Coupland ISD community (students, staff, parents, community, administration, and school board members) are, and will be, encouraged to contribute to this effort.

At the December 18, 2023, school board meeting, the Board of Trustees were presented with and approved a proposal to partner with the Education Service Center from Region XIII to support the district in an effort to create a strategic plan. The process is comprehensive and will conclude with a presentation of the communities' (students, parents, community members, school administration, and board member) work to be considered and adopted by the Board.
